The twin institutes of the Seth GS Medical College & KEM Hospital were established in 1926 with a nationalistic spirit to cater to the “health care needs of the northern parts of the island” to be manned entirely by Indians. These institutes are among the top ranked in the city and country with the Latin maxim “*Non Sibi Sed Omnibus- not for self but for all*”, embedded in every heart.

This glorious legacy now approaches its centenary, and we will be proudly celebrating our centenary / year from Jan 2025 to Jan 2026.

In 2024, the institute pushed forward to excel and touch glorious heights. After 57 years, a multi-disciplinary team carried out a heart transplant. Liver and renal transplants also stepped up similarly. Cardiology and Cardiovascular Thoracic Surgery along with Anaesthesia carried out several complex hybrid procedures. Anaesthesia also inaugurated pain services procedures. Biochemistry received recognition to start MD in Biochemistry. NABL accreditation was awarded to three departments, and it was a proud moment for us. Clinical Haematology set up a multi-disciplinary team for Haemophilia care. Clinical Pharmacology signed a MOU with the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) for recognizing the institute as a centre for Phase 1 trials for the Govt of India. Neurology saw a growth in the memory clinic and management of dementia patients. Community Medicine collaborated with the Tata Memorial Hospital to expand palliative care services. Microbiology received recognition as an ICMR center for TB diagnostics validation and MRI and CT scan services expanded with high tech machines. Faculty from many departments conducted or participated in international and national events and were awarded important orations.

A glorious paradox of an educational institute is that while the alumni grow old, the Alma Mater grows, forever young. The twin institutes would have entered their centenary when this annual report is released. A curtain raiser from 18-22 Jan 2025 will kickstart the celebrations. There several developments ongoing and several more in the pipeline. It is hoped that these developments will constructively change the institutes for betterment of patients, greater efficiency of its enormous staff and help sounder training of its students and resident medical doctors, not to forget the support staff, nursing school and her alumni.

At the end of the day, as several thousand patients walk through these hallowed portals each year with hope in their hearts, it will remain our primary responsibility to ensure that they get the best medical care from kind, caring and compassionate physicians; hands that comfort, soothe and heal. The words of Bob Dole always resonate especially at the beginning of the centenary year - “When it’s all over, it’s not who you were. It’s whether you made a difference”.

Anatomy

- Body donation awareness at Dadar in February 2024
- Department organized Collaborative workshops with clinical departments.

Biochemistry

Cardiology

- Newer diagnostic modalities including cardiopulmonary exercise testing, strain echocardiography, Transesophageal Echo with 3D reconstruction, Live 3D echo, Contrast echo and perfusion imaging, Dobutamine Stress Echocardiography are now integral part of our routine patient management. In order to cater to the ever-increasing patient-load, a New 2D echo lab was conceptualized and successfully inaugurated this year with 2 AFFINITY CVx Echo machines and ergonomic echo tables facilitating better patient management.
- Several complex interventions were performed in the cath lab, including, Transcatheter Aortic valve Replacement, coarctoplasty, coarctation stenting, Renal Artery stenting, Subclavian stenting and PCI of left main coronary lesions, complex bifurcations, OCT, rotational atherectomy.
- Department performed a couple of hybrid procedures - TEVAR for Type B Aortic Dissection.
- First to perform ‘Mitra-Clip Procedure’ for Severe Mitral Regurgitation among BMC hospitals.

Plastic Surgery

Pulmonary Medicine and EPRC

1. Sequential whole lung lavage for alveolar proteinosis: Interventional Pulmonology team along with cardiovascular anaesthesia team carried out a successful whole lung lavage for a patient with Pulmonary alveolar proteinosis, a rare condition with an estimated prevalence of about 1-2 per million people.
2. Installation of Endobronchial Ultrasound (EBUS) in Department of Pulmonary Medicine- convex probe and radial EBUS (first in BMC). Increased diagnostic yield- 80%
3. Balloon dilatation with controlled radial expansion for patients with tracheal stenosis was undertaken as a part of interventional pulmonology services
4. Forced oscillation technique is offered to patients with airway disorders for testing airway resistance and reactance without undertaking forceful manoeuvres.

Radiology

- Radiology Department has the latest and sophisticated 1.5 Tesla MRI, two CT Scan machines (64 slice and 160 slice), Mammography (for Breast Cancer Screening), Digital Fluoroscopy, Ultrasonography and Doppler machines.
- Peripheral Vascular and Neurovascular Minimally Invasive Interventions are carried out on a Bi-planar DSA machine. Conventional imaging is carried out on 5 Digital Radiography (DR) units as well as on Computed Radiography (CR) units.
- Facility for Radiofrequency Ablation (RFA) of tumors is available here. Endovenous Laser Therapy (EVLT) is done here to treat patients with varicose veins. Facility of DR Fluroscopy for Barium study exists.
- Two High End Digital Radiography X-ray (DR) and Six Computerized Radiography X-ray (CR) machines have been installed this year.

Surgical Gastroenterology

Inborn Unit: Neonates born in K.E.M. Hospital are managed in this unit.

Inborn – Out born Unit: Neonates in K.E.M. hospital at risk of infection and neonates transferred from other municipal or private hospitals are managed here.

Transitional Care Unit: This section renders transitional convalescent care to neonates once the acute stage of disease is managed in intensive care units. The babies who do not require close and continuous monitoring are looked after here.

Ventilation Unit: The babies requiring advanced ventilatory care are closely monitored and managed here.

Palliative Care Unit: Very sick babies who are nursed in any of the above sections are given supportive care, psychological counselling, and social support.

Comprehensive Lactation Management Centre: Human milk bank is an institution established for the purpose of collecting, screening processing, storing & distributing donated human milk that is dispensed to recipients who are not the biological off springs of the donor mother.

Kangaroo Mother Care Center: The department is selected as the center of excellence in India for initiating Kangaroo Mother Care for low birth weight babies. Kangaroo Mother Care Center is the first & the only of its kind in the country.

Nephrology

- This year marks the second year of Dr VN Acharya glomerulonephritis registry which was established in January 2023. Registry intends to ensure quality improvement in the treatment of patients with various GNs, facilitate long term longitudinal follow up, and create a platform for research. It has enrolled 544 patients till now. The first report of registry was presented at the Asia Pacific Society of Nephrology conference at Seoul Korea in August 2024.
- CAPD programme of home dialysis treatment was included in MPJAY govt insurance scheme. This program has enrolled 58 patients till date. It has proved an immensely helpful modality of kidney replacement therapy in children and adults.
- Services of the Intervention Nephrology Division of the department of Nephrology are being expanded to include Operation Theatre for AV Fistula creation
- **28** Live related renal transplants and **7** deceased donor renal transplants were performed from Jan 2024 upto 10th December 2024. All these patients are regularly following up at transplant clinic of the department. Total number of kidney transplants performed till date is 826.

- ICU dialysis facility is successfully running for critically ill patients in Medical Intensive Care Unit (MICU), CVTS ICU, SICU, Pediatric ICU, Respiratory ICU, and AICU.
- Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy (CRRT) was introduced as a modality to support critically ill patient
- Awareness program for patients – empowerment through employment was conducted in association with the Social Service Department and Kidney Warrior Foundation in Nov 2024. It was well appreciated and attended by over 60 patients and their caregivers
- A ‘Hand Transplant’ team is now functional in which we are involved in pre-transplant assessment and post-transplant medical management including immunosuppression regimen.
- Euroimmun Analyzer- I -2P - Automated ELISA reader with high throughput for various immunological tests was successfully installed.

Our department carries out live and cadaveric renal transplants regularly and is among the oldest institutes in India for kidney transplantation starting transplantation way back in 1965.

Laparoscopy in urology is a new upcoming modality, which is being started in major urological departments in India. Our department too has started offering 3D laparoscopic procedures to our patients. We perform laparoscopic ureterolithotomies, Lap. Nephrectomies etc. We have also procured Laparoscopy Trainer to train postgraduate students in basic Lap. Procedures before they perform them on patients. Ours is the only department in the whole state of Maharashtra which has started and has been regularly performing laparoscopic donor Nephrectomy which is consider to be the most difficult and complex urological laparoscopic operation. We also perform complex procedures such as radical cystectomy, radical prostatectomy and VVF repair.

All patients admitted to the ward are entered into the data base of the department and records are maintained on hard disk. New software has been purchased and has been modified to suit our setup.

All patients are given printed and laminated discharge paper and OPD records are also given in a Printed computerized sheath.

All OT records are maintained on the computer and the data can be retrieved immediately.

KEM Hospital launches dedicated operation theatre for pain mgmt

Mumbai: The BMC-run KEM Hospital has added a new feature. An operation theatre dedicated to pain management. A relatively new medical specialty, pain management focuses on medications, procedures, or exercises to relieve chronic pain associated with osteoarthritis, knee, spinal cord, cancer, among others.

"Pain is inevitable, but suffering is optional," said professor of anaesthesiology Dr. Sweta Salgaonkar, who heads the pain management programme at KEM Hospital. "Our well-equipped, dedicated unit will serve patients suffering from chronic pain—be it back pain, neck pain, shoulder, finger, herpes, migraine, trigeminal, interstitial cystitis, or cancer pain," she said.

KEM was the first municipal hospital to set up a pain management clinic in 2011, offering procedures such as botox shots, percutaneous injections, or nerve blocks (delivering a low dose of a local anaesthetic or corticosteroid near a target nerve) in general operation theatres. However, with a growing demand for pain management, dean Dr. Sangeeta Ravat and head of anaesthesiology Dr. Arnab Kulkarni said, the specialty deserved a dedicated OT, paving the way for the inauguration of the pain management OT on Thursday.

"The burden of chronic pain is high, but very few patients get access to it," she said. The hospital's pain OPD sees roughly 1,000 patients every year, around 80% of them need some intervention or procedures. "Pain intervention is expensive in the private sector, while we provide it at free or nominal rates," said a senior doctor from the hospital. Dr. Salgaonkar said patients with acute pain need comprehensive care that includes physiotherapy. However, when they are in pain, they would not be able to undergo physical therapy. So, pain management provides a break from the pain cycle so that the patient can be treated in a wholesome manner, she added. Research studies have shown that less than 30% of patients in India receive pain management services. An article published in "The Indian Journal of Anaesthesia" in 2017 interviewed doctors from 30 medical schools in Maharashtra and found only seven of them offered acute pain services to patients, including those who underwent surgery. "...only five out of the 30 centres provided ongoing pain education to health professionals even when the hospitals claimed to provide acute pain services," it said.

Heart transplant at KEM after 56 yrs, at 4th of pvt hosp cost

Mumbai: It was an emotional roller coaster as the BMC-run KEM Hospital performed its third heart transplant — 56 years after it carried out the country's first two heart transplants — to save the life of a 38-year-old rickshaw driver using the heart of a 34-year-old brain-dead woman who had suffered a stroke and delivered a stillborn child. The hospital performed the transplant for a fourth of the Rs 30-lakh price tag in the private sector and raised the money for the recipient's family through donations.

The operation, involving over 30 medical staff, began around 3.30 pm on Thursday (July 11) and was completed at 5.30 am on Friday. "We created a green corridor of a few hundred metres to take the donor from the ICU to the CVTS (cardiovascular and thoracic surgery) building in an ambulance with a ventilator in order to protect the organ," said KEM dean Dr Sanjeeta Ravat. The recipient is being monitored round the clock; KEM cardiothoracic dept head Dr Uday Jadhav said heart transplant patients remain critical for a few days.

Dr Ravat said the operation's cost of Rs 8 lakh was raised from donations from Tata Trusts (Rs 7 lakh) and the remaining from the state-run insurance scheme (Mahatma Phule Jan Arogya Yojana) and the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. Additional municipal commissioner Dr Sudhakar Shinde said, "KEM is the only municipal hospital in the country to start complex surgeries like heart transplant."

He said KEM had been planning to restart its heart transplant programme since 2017, but it gathered momentum in the last eight months over 40 meetings. "We got donations to buy expensive equipment, renovate the ICU and get the licence (for heart transplant) in November 2023," he said. Over 20 specialised equipment were purchased in the last nine months.

KEM is credited with the country's first two heart transplants (the world's fifth and sixth) in 1968 and then HOD Dr P K Sen was only the fourth surgeon in the world to perform them (see box).

To recreate the historic moment of 1968, the hospital received support from different quarters. Visiting surgeon Dr Pravin Kulkarni, who is attached to Jupiter Hospital in Thane, was a part of the transplant team as well

IN '68 HOSP DID WORLD'S 5TH & 6TH SUCH SURGERY

On Feb 16, 1968, KEM Hospital head of cardiothoracic surgery department, Dr P K Sen, became only the fourth surgeon in the world to perform a heart transplant



► As there was no law on brain death those days, the donor heart was retrieved only after it had ceased beating. This led to poor results (the male farmer who received the heart died within hours of the operation)



► The same team performed India's 2nd heart transplant in September 1968, but the patient developed complications and died the next day (In 1994, India's first successful heart transplant was carried out in AIIMS, Delhi)

heart transplants began in Mumbai in 2015. However, only a handful of hospitals in the city offer the transplant so far, and cities in south India lead in the field.

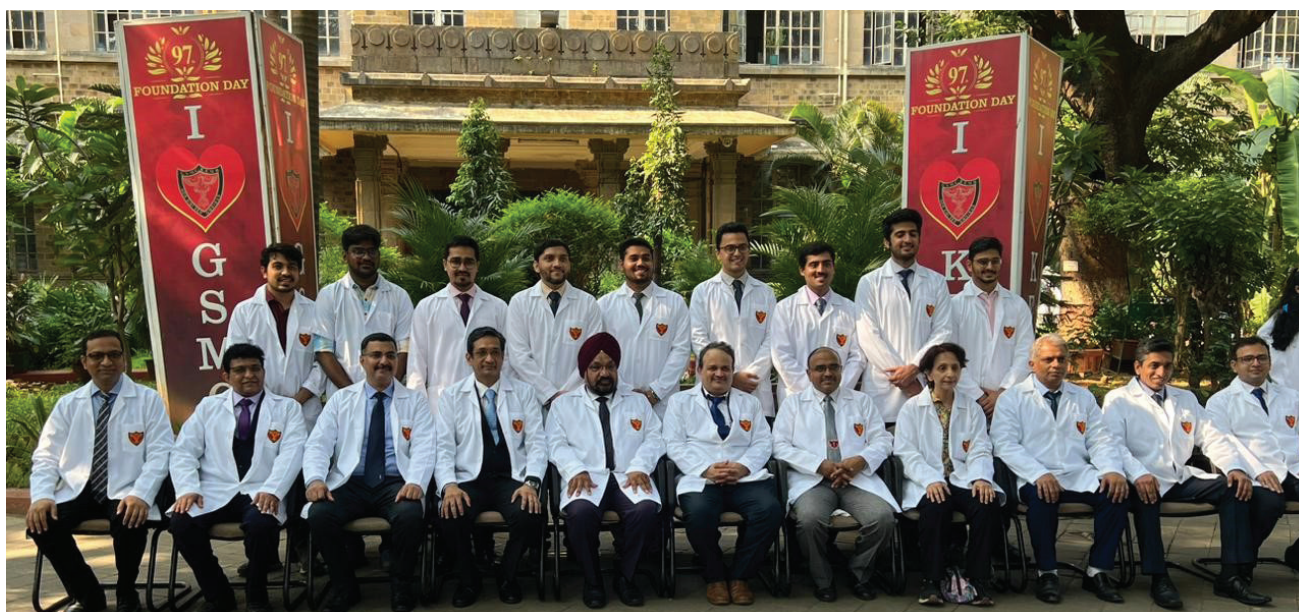

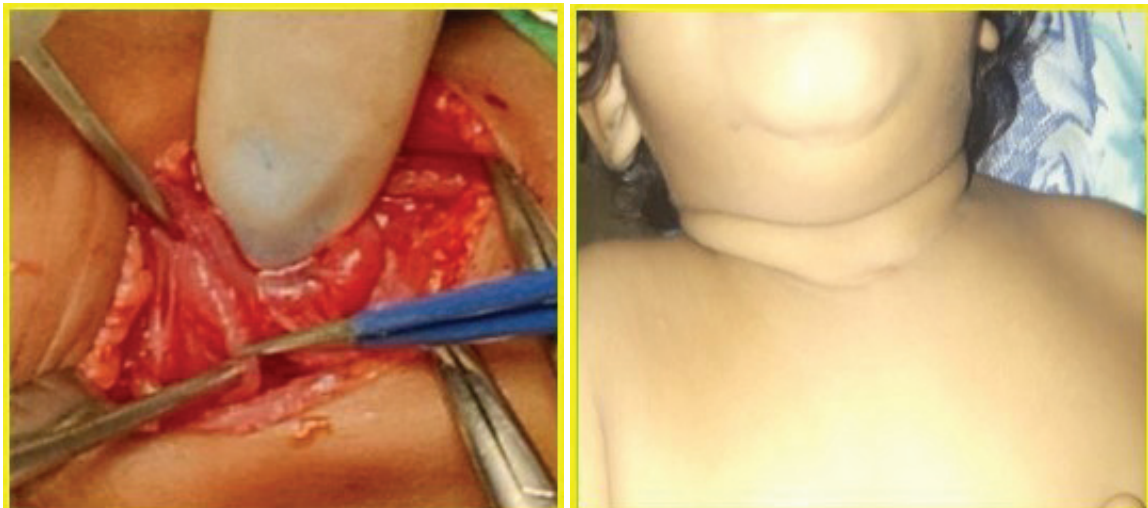

The journal does not charge the Authors or Authors' institutions for the submission, processing and/or publications of manuscripts. However, the Journal charges a nominal fee for color reproduction of colored images/photographs/figures. JPGM promotes published papers by electronically supplying the records to the National Library of Medicine at the time of online publication, making it sure that the citations are retrievable from MEDLINE as early as possible. Similarly, the citations in MEDLINE are cross-linked from the official site of MEDLINE to the journal's site, thus the readership of published articles is increased many folds. The journal is registered with the following abstracting partners: Baidu Scholar, CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure), EBSCO Publishing's Electronic Databases, Ex Libris – Primo Central, Google Scholar, Hinari, Infotrieve, National Science Library, ProQuest, TdNet, and Wanfang Data. The journal is indexed with, or included in, the following: DOAJ, EMBASE/ Excerpta Medica, Emerging Sources Citation Index, Indian Science Abstracts, IndMed, MEDLINE/ Index Medicus, PubMed Central, Scimago Journal Ranking, SCOPUS, Science Citation Index Expanded, and Web of Science. Currently the journal is in its 70th year of being published. Impact Factor[®] as reported in the 2023 Journal Citation Reports[®] (Clarivate Analytics, 2024) is 1.0 and the 5 year impact factor is 2.0. Journal of Postgraduate Medicine has h-index of 62, meaning that 62 articles of this journal have more than 62 numbers of citations. Seth GS Medical College - Multidisciplinary Research Unit [GSMC-MRU]

The Seth G S Medical College Multidisciplinary Research Unit (GSMC MRU) serves as the central research laboratory of the institution which is one of the requirements for the institute to be recognized by the National Medical Commission. It is located on the 1st & 2nd Floor of the Mortuary Building of the institute. It was established under the aegis of the Central Sector Scheme of the Department of Health Research (DHR), Government of India for the development of infrastructure for promotion of health research in different areas of non-communicable diseases. The unit received funding from DHR in September 2014 and started functioning from June 2016.

Mandate:

- To encourage and strengthen an environment of research in non-communicable diseases (NCD).
- To bridge the gap in the infrastructure which is inhibiting health research
- To improve the overall health status by creating evidence-based application of diagnostic procedures/processes.

The GSMC-MRU is headed by Dr. Sangeeta Ravat, Dean (G&K). Dr. Sandhya Kamat, Professor & Head, Department of Pharmacology & Therapeutics is the Nodal officer. The scientific and technical work at MRU is managed by 2 research scientists, 2 lab technicians and 1 lab assistant cum data entry operator. The overall management of the unit is done as per the recommendations of the Local advisory Committee (LAC), the Research Advisory Committee (RAC) and the Purchase committee (PC). The RAC has been formed as per ICMR requirement and has 7 external and 7 internal members from various specialties as recommended by ICMR.

The day-to-day working of the Center is carried out by Mr. Sandeep Mehendale, the Facility Manager.

The Maharashtra Telemedicine Project was initiated as a collaborative project of the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Govt. of Maharashtra (GoM), and Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation. The project is one of the major initiatives under the National Health Mission (NHM). The KEM Hospital Telemedicine Center has been connected with Telemedicine Centers at Aheri, Alibaug, Chandrapur, Karad, Kamathe, Nandurbar, Navapur, Ratnagiri, Sindhudurg, Sawantwadi, Satara, Shahapur and Thane through a satellite link & Broadband connection. The KEM Telemedicine Center is working as a

Speciality Center and its doctors are providing expert advice (all specialties and super-specialities) to patients and doctors from these peripheral centers.

In the period January 2024 - November 2024 a total of 8165 patients have derived the benefit of expert advice from specialists of KEM Hospital. The disciplines whose opinions have been sought include anesthesiology, ayurvedic medicine, cardiology, cardio-thoracic surgery, chest medicine, dermatology, dentistry, endocrinology, gastro-enterology, gastro-enterology surgery, general medicine, general surgery, gynecology and obstetrics, hematology, neonatology, neurology, neurosurgery, ophthalmology, orthopedics, otorhinolaryngology, pediatric surgery, pediatrics, plastic surgery, and radiology.

Through this Telemedicine Center, KEM Hospital and Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai are providing their contribution for promotion of health of Maharashtra's rural populace. A. Clinical Dietetic Service

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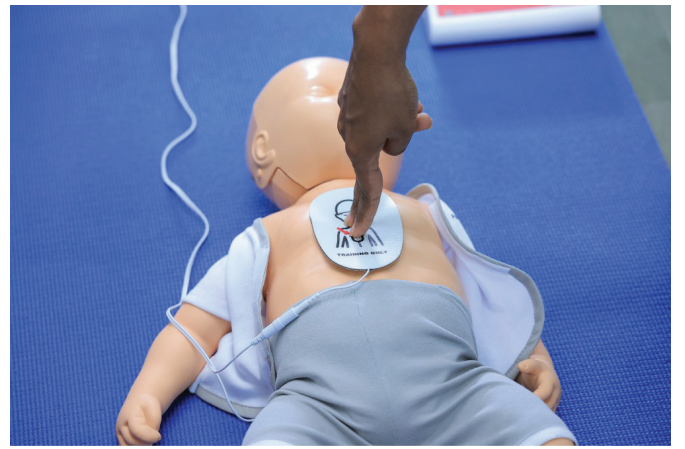

Live liver transplant at KEM after 14 yrs, 9-year-old boy gets donation from mom

Mumbai: BMC-run KEM Hospital in Parel has successfully conducted a liver transplant with a living donor after 14 years. On June 3, a 35-year-old woman donated a portion of her liver to her nine-year-old son suffering from a genetic disorder, Wilson's disease. While the mother, Salmia Khan, is likely to be discharged on Saturday, the boy, Abdullah, will stay in the ICU for another 10 days. This is the second liver transplant in KEM Hospital in the last two months, in whole liver donation from a donor. The premier teaching hospital had stopped live donor-

related liver transplants after a donor, a 51-year-old mother died after the operation. Liver transplants are considered one of the most difficult surgeries because the organ and other vital chemicals, and the transplant requires coordination between multiple departments and scores of doctors and nurses.

On Friday, doctors from KEM Hospital's gastroenterology, surgery and gastroenterology departments met to discuss the fit for discharge. "Our recipient has started taking oral schedule," said KEM Hospital surgeon Dr. Sangeeta Ravat. KEM Hospital had this

year upgraded its liver ICU with funds from a donor and support from additional municipal commissioner Dr. Sudhakar Shinde. "However, it's the hard work by our doctors and nurses that have brought about the change in this family's life," said Dr. Shinde. The Khans moved to Mumbai from Kampur in 2021 when Abdullah was six. "I have lost three children - a boy and two girls - to jaundice in the last 15 years. We Abdullah," said Salmia. One of her daughters who died at two was Abdullah's twin.

After meeting several doctors across Mumbai, they came to KEM Hospital where Abdullah was for the first time diagnosed with Wilson's disease, a condition in which copper levels in several organs, especially the liver, brain and eyes. "The doctors put him on medication that worked well for a year and he was doing well in school," said Salmia. It was when they left Mumbai for a visit to Kampur that his condition deteriorated. The family rushed back to KEM Hospital, where doctors detected acute liver failure. The family was consulted about liver transplant and Salmia was found to be a match for Abdullah. "I want to defeat this disease that since I got married 15 years ago, I realised that donating my liver was the only way to do so," said Salmia.
